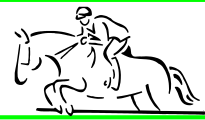

Officiation: The qualifying divisions will be run in accordance with the following rule books, the non-qualifying will be run as close to these rules as possible:

- Ⓢ Current USPC Annual Newsletters for Show Jumping, Tetrathlon, and Horse Management
- Ⓢ USPC Uniform Officiation Rules
- Ⓢ USPC Code of Conduct for Members and Adults
- Ⓢ USEF Rulebook (Current Edition)

TENTATIVE RALLY SCHEDULE: Barns will open at 12:00 on Friday, March 20th with Welcome & Briefing tentatively scheduled for 4:00pm. Due to timing of the Tetrathlon Swim Phase for Fri evening we are unable to do the official briefing any later than this. Mandatory soundness checks and helmet checks will immediately follow the briefing. For “late arrivals” a separate jog out will be done Sat AM (please contact the organizer if you will be a late arrival). Complete rally schedule will be provided in team packets and posted on the rally site. For Tetrathlon the Swim Phase will be Friday evening, Running Phase will be Sat morning, Jump Phase will be Saturday, and Shooting phase will be Sunday morning (unless time allows for this to occur on Sat).

GENERAL RALLY INFORMATION:

- ⊙ Competitors that are participating in *both* the Show Jumping Rally and Tetrathlon will be stabled with their Show Jumping teammates in accordance with the Show Jumping eligibility rules. Your individual horse management score will be the score used for both rallies.
- ⊙ Members participating in Tetrathlon only will be housed in the Tetrathlon section of the barn. These teams *may* be scrambled as needed. If there are not enough entries to make full teams, members may be scrambled with Show Jumping teams.
- ⊙ Each team will consist of 3-4 mounted members with one member to be named as Team Captain. Both Show Jumping and Tetrathlon teams may now have stable managers. Refer to the information for each discipline for additional team specifics. Scramble teams will be arranged as necessary
- ⊙ Each team must name a team Chaperone and all chaperones must sign the Chaperone Duties Form. For scramble teams, one person will be selected from the names submitted.
- ⊙ **All mounted competitors MUST be able to SAFELY manage their horse with MINIMAL assistance.**
- ⊙ **LONGEING:** If you know a horse will need to be longed while at rally, you must provide a qualified person for longeing (refer to current HM Handbook for list of qualified persons). This person must be aware of and adhere to the Pony Club guidelines for longeing (ie: correct attire & equipment as specified in the HM Handbook)
- ⊙ A competitor’s rating as of the rally closing date (**March 1st**) will be the one he/she must compete as.
- ⊙ Any competitor who is showing a second horse in an open class must manage their time so that their team is not adversely affected in any way.

PROGRAM ADVERTISEMENTS/GOOD LUCK MEMOS: We will be offering spots in our program for Business Advertisements as well as memos to competitors. Please see the Program Advertisement Form included with this packet.

TEAM COACHES: A coach is required for all SJ and Tet competitors. In accordance with concerns voiced by the DC’s, each club must provide at least one coach for all their SJ competitors and D level Tet competitors. All Coaches must sign the Guidelines for Coaching form(s) included with this packet. As with all rallies, each coach must be willing to assist any rider who asks for help. **A coaches meeting will be held prior to Sat AM rides with time and location to be announced. Each club needs to make sure their coach is aware of this meeting.** **NOTE:** Coaches for open class riders are not expected to follow the guidelines stated on the coaches’ form.

STABLING:

- ⊙ Stalls will be provided for Tack and Feed Rooms
- ⊙ Initial Stall Bedding (2 bags) will be provided. Additional shavings will be available for purchase at the show office (or may be purchased from local feed store).
- ⊙ Stall assignments will be made and posted.
- ⊙ Barn fans will be permitted with approved extension cords (Refer to HM Handbook, section III, article 80).
- ⊙ At completion of the rally, horse stalls must be cleaned out in accordance with facility requirements (this will be announced during the briefing). Tack and feed stalls must be **COMPLETELY** cleaned out. **A \$50 stall deposit must be submitted per club. At completion of the rally, if the above stall requirements are not met then this check will be kept. For tack and feed stalls of a scramble team, this deposit will be kept for all clubs on that team.**

GENERAL DRESS:

- ⊙ Medical Armbands with a current USPC Medical Card or Medical Bracelets complying with USPC HM Rulebook must be worn at all times while on rally grounds.
- ⊙ Barn attire must be in accordance with the current HM Handbook. Shirts with offensive wording will not be allowed and all attire needs be fully intact (no rips, tears, frayed hems, etc).
- ⊙ Jog-outs (refer to HM Handbook): Collared shirt; neat pants, shorts or skirt; helmet; appropriate footwear; gloves are recommended. Remember this is the first time you are officially presenting yourself and your horse to the CHMJ, so you want to make the right impression!
- ⊙ Competition attire is outlined under each discipline’s information section.

VOLUNTEERS: The success of every rally is dependent on volunteer support. The list of volunteers needed for this rally is included with the packet and will also be posted on the rally grounds. We **need all adults attending the rally to volunteer** for at least one position. A **Volunteer briefing** will be held **Friday evening** immediately following the competitor briefing. Anyone **volunteering as an AHMJ** will need to report to the CHMJ when they arrive on the grounds.

NO SMOKING IS ALLOWED IN BARN AREAS, ON SHOW GROUNDS, ON CROSS COUNTRY COURSE OR AROUND MEMBERS AT THE RALLY.

DOG POLICY: For the safety of our competitors and spectators please keep dogs out of the barns and on a leash at all times.

ALL Motorized vehicles on show grounds must be operated by a **licensed driver**. No unauthorized motorized vehicles are allowed on the cross-country course.

USE OF BAR-B-QUE PITS: or any other cooking devise that produces smoke will not be allowed near the show arenas, warm up areas or the show barns.

MEALS: Plantation's Pride will host a concession stand will be on the grounds. Limited local restaurants are close by.

RALLY T-SHIRTS: Shirts commemorating this rally are available by preorder only. Use the Order Form included with this packet and include it, along with your payment, with your rally entry. Personal checks will be accepted for shirt orders. There will not be any extra shirts available at the rally, so if you want one of these shirts you need to preorder.

HOTEL: A Block of rooms has been reserved at the Country Inn and Suites at 130 Holiday Blvd, Covington, LA). The **deadline for reservations is Friday Feb. 28th.** Available rooms are Standard Room (Double Queen-4 ppl) for \$99.00 plus tax, or a King guest room (2 ppl) for \$99.00 plus tax, or a King Studio Suite (4 ppl) for \$114.00 plus tax, or a 1 bedroom, King Suite (4 ppl) for \$124.00 plus tax or a 1 bedroom 2 Queen Suite (6 ppl) for \$134.00 plus tax. Breakfast is included and will open at 6:00 am. Please call 985-809-0467 and ask for the block room rate for **Deep South Region Pony Clubs.**

HOOKUPS are available at Lagniappe for \$50 for the weekend. **There are 8 hookups with electricity only. You must contact Bebe Brown (337-654-2727) to reserve a spot.** Payment for the spot must be submitted at the time of check in and all checks need to be written to **Lagniappe Equestrian Center.**

JENNIFER MERRICK-BROOKS CLINIC: Following the rally, there is possibility for a mini clinic with small groups, time permitting. Please contact Bebe Brown (337-654-2727) for details.

DIRECTIONS TO LAGNIAPPE:

Coming from I-12 (east or west): Take Covington/Mandeville exit to US 190 toward Covington. Once through Covington take split to the left onto Hwy 25. Stay on Hwy 25 through Folsom. Once through Folsom you will see Spencer's Feed Store on the left and almost immediately the sign for Lagniappe on the right (white sign with jumping horse). Turn right onto Verger road. Lagniappe is at the end of the road.

Coming from I-59: Take Poplarville exit, Hwy 26 west towards Bogalusa. Once through Bogalusa, this hwy will turn into Hwy 10. Stay on Hwy 10 through Franklinton. Once through Franklinton take Hwy 25 south towards Folsom. Before reaching Folsom, you will see the sign for Lagniappe (white sign with jumping horse) on your left. Turn left onto Verger road. Lagniappe is at the end of the road. HINT: If you see Spencer's Feed Store on your right you have gone too far.

Coming from I-55: Take Amite Exit (Hwy 16). Go east on Hwy 16. Turn right onto Route 450 South. This will dead end at Hwy 25. Turn right onto Hwy 25 towards Folsom. At about 1.5 miles, before reaching Folsom, you will see the sign for Lagniappe (white sign with jumping horse) on your left. Turn left onto Verger road. Lagniappe is at the end of the road. HINT: If you see Spencer's Feed Store on your right you have gone too far.

Show Jumping Competitors

Show Jumping is a 2-day rally and will include the following divisions.

The 12" and 18" classes and arenas will be reduced in size. The 2'3" and Introductory division will have no combinations. All Show Jumping divisions will consist of three rounds of competition (2 Saturday and 1 Sunday). The first round on Saturday AM will be a Jumper Round with a Jump-Off for a clear round. The second round (Saturday afternoon) will be Equitation. Sunday mornings round will be a "take-your-own-line." (See Show Jumping Rulebook, 2020)

Any size pony may enter the Introductory Division. Medium (12.2-13.3H) and Large (13.2-14.2H) ponies only may enter the Developing Horse & Rider Division and distances will be adjusted accordingly. Modified - Large Pony (May include Medium and Large Ponies, and all ponies entered in this division must be prepared to jump the heights and spreads listed in the Specifications listed in Appendix I. Distances and combinations will be adjusted appropriately.)

The non-qualifying levels will not depend on the rider's level or the size of the horse: they will be offered to those who do not feel comfortable jumping at the higher levels. TEAM INFORMATION

- Ⓢ Teams will be mixed and scored as D Level (UR – D2 Traditional/HSE certified competitors) and Upper Level (competitors certified D3 Classic/HSE and above). D3 Traditional/HSE mounted competitors and D3 HM stable manager competitors may choose either division. Teams will be mixed in one barn.
- Ⓢ Teams may be composed of riders of mixed jumping levels.
- Ⓢ Sharing of horses: A horse may be shared by two UR – D level certified riders with only one shared horse per team. Both riders MUST be entered in a division no higher than 2'. When determining appropriateness of sharing a horse, please take into consideration the condition of the horse and the hot weather.
- Ⓢ Riders are not allowed to ride in the warm up area unless supervised by a coach. It is possible for a rider to ask a coach from another club to supervise them.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

Traditional Qualifiers:

- Ⓢ All competitors (including SM's) wishing to qualify for the 2020 Show Jumping Championships must meet the USPC certification for the level they are attempting to qualify for and must be at 12 years old as of Jan 1st, 2020.
- Ⓢ Competitors at all traditional levels must be certified as C1 DR/Flat/EV/HSE or above
- Ⓢ Stable Managers: Competitor must be certified at least D3 HM
- Ⓢ All mounted competitors are competing as a horse and rider combination. If the horse you use for rally is not the one on your entry form you must notify the organizer so that the correct horse can be reflected on all rally scoring sheets.
- Ⓢ Qualifiers can have no more than 12 jumping faults at a minimum of 3 qualifying rounds at their qualifying rally to be eligible for Championships.
- Ⓢ Any rider who has been eliminated for any reason in any round at a qualifying rally will not be eligible for the Championships Rally (not limited to qualifying rounds).
- Ⓢ All competitors (including SM) wishing to qualify must complete the Championship Declaration on their entry form.

Modified Qualifiers:

- Ⓢ All competitors (including SM's) wishing to qualify for the 2020 Show Jumping Modified Championships must meet the USPC certification for the level they are attempting to qualify for and must be at 10 years old as of Jan 1st, 2020.
- Ⓢ Introductory and Developing Horse & Rider divisions: Competitors must be certified as D2 DR/Flat/EV/HSE or above.
- Ⓢ Advanced (Large Pony, Horse 1 and above): Competitors must be certified as C1 DR/Flat/EV/HSE or above.
- Ⓢ Stable Managers: Competitor must be certified at least D2 HM

- Ⓢ All mounted competitors are competing as a horse and rider combination. If the horse you use for rally is not the one on your entry form you must notify the organizer so that the correct horse can be reflected on all rally scoring sheets.
- Ⓢ Modified eligibility: can have no more than 24 jumping faults at a minimum of 2 qualifying rounds at their qualifying rally to be eligible for the Modified Division at Championships.
- Ⓢ Any rider who has been eliminated for any reason in any round at a qualifying rally will not be eligible for the Championships Rally (not limited to qualifying rounds).
- Ⓢ All competitors (including SM) wishing to qualify must complete the Championship Declaration on their entry form.

DRESS:

- Ⓢ D Level-Non-qualifying: Simple, clean and safe attire. Breeches and tall boots or jodphers and jodphers boots, a polo shirt with collar and sleeves or a turtleneck.
- Ⓢ Qualifying and C Level: New competitor attire rules in SJ Rulebook. NOTE: D3's and D2's attempting to qualify for Championships (in either Traditional or Modified) must also adhere to this dress requirement.

AWARDS: Team ribbons will be awarded to all teams in order of placing overall and for horse management. Medals will be awarded for the horse managers of the first three teams.

Tetrathlon Competitors

Both Qualifying and Non-qualifying divisions will be offered. Refer to the Tetrathlon Division chart included with this packet.

TEAM INFORMATION: Since Tetrathlon is based on individual scoring, competitors at different levels *and certifications* may be combined to form teams. We will arrange scramble teams as necessary.

DRESS: (refer to 2020 Handbook and Rules for Tetrathlon for specifics)

- Ⓢ Riding Phase: Shirt with collar and sleeves, breeches, jodphurs or riding tights of any color, tall boots or paddock boots with or without full grain leather half-chaps
- Ⓢ Running Phase: Shirts or singlets must be worn. Spikes or cleats are permitted.
- Ⓢ Swimming Phase: One-piece suits that are in good taste and suitable for the event. Swim caps are required and goggles are optional.
- Ⓢ Shooting Phase: Dressed neatly in appropriate attire, closed toe shoes must be worn by competitors, loaders & coaches
- Ⓢ Medical armbands or Medical bracelets are required at all times. Armbands do not need to be worn when swimming or shooting, but must be visible during these activities.

RIDING PHASE:

- Ⓢ Horse Sharing – One horse may be shared by up to three riders (refer to Tetrathlon Rulebook, for the specifics on sharing a horse). A horse may not be shared if it is being used for Tet and a Qualifying level in Show Jumping or is already being shared by 2 members of a Show Jumping team.
- Ⓢ The horse you ride during the rally does not have to be the one you ride at Championships.
- Ⓢ Jump Course – The jump course will take place in an enclosed ring. Competitors doing the Non-Qualifying Mini, Rookie and Pre-Novice Divisions will not be required to manipulate the gate or slip rail.
- Ⓢ To encourage safe participation, a competitor in the qualifying divisions in Novice, Intermediate, Junior and Senior shall be allowed to drop in the Ride, Swim and Run Phases. Please refer to the 2020 Tetrathlon Rulebook and the 2020 Tetrathlon Newsletter for the drop-down penalties and Championship requirements. The intention to drop down must be declared before the start of the phase.

NEW RULE CHANGES 2019

- Scoring
 - Horse Management Score = 1100 – (HM Penalties x 50)
 - Overall Final Score = HM Score + Riding Score + Running Score + Shooting Score + Swimming Score

SHOOTING PHASE: Please contact the organizer before the rally if you need to borrow a pistol. If you are bringing your own pistol it must be turned in to the Shooting Phase Steward *on the morning of the shooting phase*. (Consult the Tetrathlon Rulebook concerning labeling) *Safety glasses or eyeglasses are required*. Mini, Rookie, Pre-Novice and Novice shooters are *required to have a loader* and must make advanced arrangements for a loader.

CHAMPIONSHIP ELIGIBILITY:

- Ⓢ All competitors wishing to qualify for the 2020 Tetrathlon Championships must meet the USPC certification and age requirements for the level they are attempting to qualify for. Refer to the Tetrathlon Division chart included with this packet for the requirements for each qualifying level. The age a competitor is as of Jan 1st, 2020 is the age used to determine eligibility.
- Ⓢ All competitors wishing to qualify must complete the Championship Declaration on their entry form.

AWARDS:

- Ⓢ **Phase Awards** – First Place Ribbon for each phase in each division.
- Ⓢ **Combined Score Awards** -1st – 8th Place Ribbons for combined overall scores in each division. There will be no horse management awards, however, horse management scores may be used to break ties

To encourage safe participation, a competitor in the qualifying divisions in Novice, Intermediate, Junior and Senior shall be allowed to drop down in the Ride, Swim and Run phases. Please refer to the 2020 Tetrathlon Rulebook and the 2019 Tetrathlon Newsletter for the drop-down penalties and Championship requirements. The intention to drop down must be declared before the start of the phase.

**Stable managers must meet the minimum age criteria of their division, and be a D-2 HM for the modified divisions and a D-3 HM for all other divisions.

Chaperone Responsibilities/Duties

This page is intended for the use of the team Chaperone.
It should not be sent in with team competition entry.

Definition of Chaperone:

When competitors under the age of majority (minors) participate in local, regional and national competitions, there will be a designated “Official Team Chaperone.” In the situation of scramble teams the official team chaperone(s) will be appointed by the rally officials and will be so noted in the rally program as such. The role of this person is to give the rally organizers a responsible adult to contact for any needs and to give the team members a contact to assist them as may be indicated and allowed. (When competitors above the age of majority (adults) participate in local, regional and national competitions, they will use the emergency contact form to submit to rally organizers.)

Hours for tour of duty are...

The official team chaperone is responsible for team members during the hours of competition and on competition grounds only (from arrival on grounds until departing rally ground at beginning and end of each day of competition).

Transportation, driving and lodging...

Decisions to allow a competitor to drive or not, who they can or cannot ride with, who they can or cannot have in a vehicle that they are driving, where they stay at night and with whom they stay, and who is to be responsible for a competitor are all decisions that must be made by the parent/legal guardian. These decisions are not a decision of the USPC, any region, club/center or rally organizer. Specific arrangements must be made by and between the parent/legal guardian and the adult assuming any of these responsibilities in the absence of the parent/guardian.

Helping your team to succeed:

Initiate contact with all team members prior to leaving for the competition, and gather cell phone numbers as appropriate. In cases of scramble team members, request contact information from the rally secretary. Share this information with team captain and/or stable manager (SM).

Encourage the team to have meetings prior to leaving for rally. Be sure all members of a scramble team are included in the decision making process, either by email or phone contact, if a distance away. Discuss team equipment, review all rules that apply and any decisions regarding snacks, drinks, plans for meals, etc. Determine how the team members plan to provide snacks and drinks (i.e., each team member contribute a sum of money to a pot or each member is assigned specific items to bring.) If each is contributing money, it must be collected

before the rally. Be sure you know who is bringing cooler(s), so you can avoid the quick trip to the local store.

Plan arrival time at the competition site and any details such as arrangements for ordering bedding, if needed, and who is assigned to do this (again collect money in advance if needed).

On the first day of the rally, gather the team together before they separate for the night and make plans for the next day. Include a review of their competition schedule and how they can best work together to help each other prepare for turnout inspections.

Determine a regular meeting place and plan to have a scheduled discussion session at the end of each day of competition. Take this opportunity to offer words of praise, acknowledge their accomplishments and encourage the sense of teamwork and team building. Guide the team towards constructive criticism and steer them away from finger pointing. Have the team make plans for the next day concerning time they will arrive on the competition grounds, who will feed horses the next morning, who will re-supply the tack room cooler with ice, drinks and snacks (get requests for drinks/snacks) and make the plans for lunch. Be sure any plans for cooler and/or lunch delivery follow any requirements as stated in the competition entry packet (neutral zone) and they understand the plan. Have the team leave with a plan for the next day in place before they go off for an evening of relaxation.

Chaperone Form

for USPC Members Below the Age of Majority

To be completed by the chaperone and turned in with rally entry.

Chaperone duties shall include:

1. The primary function of the “Official Team Chaperone” is to ensure that there is a contact person for each team or individual present and on grounds for the duration of the competition. Team chaperones must be available to rally officials and team members at all times.
2. Have copy of and be familiar with the rules for the competition (discipline rulebook) and the current edition of the Horse Management Handbook and Rules for Rallies. Rulebooks can be downloaded from the USPC website at www.ponyclub.org
3. Uphold USPC Policy 0500 Drug/Alcohol/Tobacco. Chaperones must refrain from using alcohol or other substances when they are serving in their “official capacity” as team chaperone. Refer to USPC website www.ponyclub.org for full policy statement.
4. Be present and available to rally officials and all team members for the duration of the competition.
5. Delegate duties of the team chaperone to another responsible adult if for any reason you should have to leave the competition grounds during the hours of competition making it clear that they are to respond to rally officials and any team members in your absences.
6. Be sure to have a means of contacting parents or designated responsible person for all team members in the event that you should need to contact them during the hours that you are responsible for those team members (hours of competition).
7. Have a means of contacting all team members and the parent or responsible person for those hours after competition and when not on competition grounds (evening/nights).
8. Administration of medications is the sole responsibility of the parent/guardian.
9. Be familiar with the effects of heat and humidity and the potential risk for heat related illness. Take an active role in helping to keep all team members well hydrated; the importance of hydration cannot be overstated! Take every opportunity to encourage water breaks. Refer to the uniform officiation rules found in the Horse Management Handbook and on the USPC website www.ponyclub.org
10. In cases of scramble teams, the competition organizer will determine the “official team chaperone.”
11. Be aware that USPC members are required to wear a current, up-to-date USPC medical card/bracelet on their arm at all USPC activities.

Appendix VI Show Jumping Coaches Form and Guidelines

The role of a coach is to assist the rider learning:

1. Warm-up area techniques,
2. The assessment of the course,
3. How to deal with mistakes made on course,
4. The rules of competition before competition begins.
 - A Pony Club coach is expected to help any Pony Club competitor who asks for help or who is present without a coach.
 - The coach is not present to give a riding lesson in the warm up area. It is the coach's job to aid the rider in managing the confusion of a competitive warm-up area as well as dealing with dangerous traffic situations.
 - All teams/individuals must have a coach; teams/individuals may share a coach.
 - The coach's name must be included on the entry form.
 - The coach must be familiar with and comply with the current USPC Rules for Show Jumping Competitions and should assist riders in learning these rules before the competition begins.
 - The coach must wear the identification provided by the organizer during the competition times. Those times are defined to be at least from the opening to the closing of stables each day.

Communication between coaches and competitors during the competition is limited to:

1. The official briefing and any subsequent briefings, as required by the organizer;
2. Show jumping course walks;
3. Show jumping warm ups;
4. A brief meeting following the show jumping round in the schooling area if the rider so desires.

Coaches must:

1. Attend the official briefing for coaches;
2. Attend the official course walk if held.

Every rider must have a coach present while jumping.

1. All coaches must be identified so they are easily recognized as a coach.
2. While each rider must be under a coach's direct supervision, it is not required to be the coach who came with that team.
3. A rider in the schooling area whose coach is not present may/should approach another coach and ask for help.

A coach may not be:

1. A team chaperone, except with the permission of the organizer;
2. The organizer, any member of the organizing committee or any other official of the competition;
3. A regional supervisor at a regional competition.

The duties of a coach shall be limited to the jumping phases of competitions and may include:

1. Observing, but not participation in, any pre-competitive soundness check and any daily soundness checks.
2. Accompanying competitors during course inspection or at any other subsequent times that the courses are open for walking, during which they may give advice and coach.
3. Assisting competitors in the designated schooling area.
4. No competitor is to jump in the warm-up area without a coach present and watching the ride. Jumping a fence without the attention of a coach shall result in ELIMINATION.
5. Briefly meet with the rider after the round for feedback on the round, if the rider desires. This meeting will be held in or very near the gate to the schooling area; under no circumstances will interfere with the care of the horse, under penalty of elimination of the rider.
6. If necessary, a coach may lead a competitor's horse into the arena.

The coach must not interfere with the immediate care of the horse under penalty of elimination of the competitor from that round, in accordance with the rules for unauthorized assistance.

A coach may assist in standard adjustments of tack (tightening girth, changing the length of stirrups) in the warm up area without the requirement of an additional safety check.

- If these standard adjustments can not be made while mounted, the rider may dismount without the need of an additional safety check.
- At all times coaches must be aware of the unauthorized assistance rule. They must not enter the stable area except at authorized visiting times.
- The paddock master/judge/ground jury under the rules governing unauthorized assistance will penalize violations of these coaching guidelines.
- All coaches must sign that they have read this sheet:

Guidelines for Coaching Tetrathlon

Photocopy as needed. One copy should be given to the coach; a signed copy should be retained by the organizer.

By agreeing to serve as a USPC coach, you:

- Agree to be familiar with and observe all USPC By-Laws, Policies and Competition Rules.
- Agree to adhere to the USPC Conflict of Interest and Code of Ethics Policies in all your actions and decisions.
- Agree to disclose any possible potential conflicts of interest.
- Agree to conduct yourself in a fair and courteous manner.
- Agree to the confidentiality of discussions and actions.
- Give permission for a criminal background check.
- Agree to uphold USPC Policy 0500 Drug/ Alcohol/Tobacco. Chaperones must refrain from using alcohol or other substances when they are serving in their "official capacity" as team Chaperone – refer to USPC web site ponyclub.org for full policy statement.

All teams and individuals **may** have phase coaches.

All coaches must be familiar with Pony Club and Tetrathlon, the riding phase rules and scoring, and may be asked to assist competitors in learning the rules prior to rally.

All coaches must wear identification provided by the organizer during the rally times.

Communication between coaches and competitors is limited to:

1. Official briefings
2. Course walks
3. Warm-up
4. Schooling times provided during a multi-day rally
5. Horse matching sessions when a strange mount must be borrowed
6. Brief critique following the jumping phase

Coaches must:

1. Attend the official briefing
2. Attend the official course walk
3. Attend any other briefing or walk required

Duties as pertained to the jumping phase:

1. Observing, but not participating in, any pre-competitive soundness checks
2. Assist in matching if a borrowed mount must be used
3. Accompany competitors during the course inspection or at any other subsequent times the courses are open for walking, during which time coaches may give advice.
4. Assist competitors in the designated schooling/warm-up area.

5. Short debriefing of competitors after they exit the competition area, if desired by competitor
6. May, if needed, lead/assist getting the competitor's mount through the in-gate
7. May request an adjustment of tack. If granted the competitor must return to Horse Management for a safety check on the adjustment.

The coach may not interfere with the immediate care of the mount under penalty of elimination of the competitor from that phase, in accordance with the rules of unauthorized assistance.

SPIRIT OF COACHING

The role of a coach is to assist the competitor

1. In learning warm-up area techniques,
2. In the assessment of the running and riding courses and shooting range condition,
3. In learning how to deal with mistakes made.
4. In learning the rules of competition before competition begins.

The presence of a coach at a Tetrathlon rally is to promote safety, good sportsmanship during all phases and good horsemanship in the warm-up area and during the riding phase.

A Pony Club coach is expected to help any Pony Club competitor who asks for help or who is present without a coach.

The coach is not present to give a riding lesson in the warm up area.
